Learning from Other Self-Governments

The SXTA explores other self-governing First Nations

The SXTA has been visiting other self-governing nations to explore what life can look like after Treaty. Visiting these other self-governing nations gives the SXTA an opportunity to learn from other's mistakes, see how the health and well-being of the nations are doing, and gain beneficial insight regarding different self-governing topics. A broader insight into these nations helps the SXTA plan for future in treaty accordingly. Communities visited so far are: Nunatsiavut in Labrador and

the 5 Maa-nulth treaty nations on located on the west coast of Vancouver Island. A few topics that they urged the SXTA to pursue are: being prepared for implementation, teaching the youth, frequent communications, ensuring agreements are in place for different specifics, emphasizing what you will gain after Treaty, and much more!

The Outreach team plans on presenting more details about these explorations with other self-governing nations in different ways. Stay tuned!


One common comment we hear from self-governing nations: "We would never go back to being under the Indian Act!"

Shxwelméxwelh (Constitution) Update

The Stó:lō Xwexwilmexw Outreach Team and Community Champions, Joy Hall, Jazmine Horne, Lydia Archie, Amelia Roberts, and Magdalena Kelly completed the first phase of door-to-door information sharing and gathering throughout February and March 2020.

The information gathered during this process will now be presented to the SXTA Leadership. We would like to raise our hands to all that participated and gave your valuable input into this critical self-governing piece to the Treaty.

As of April 2020, here are results from 130 people that answered how they would vote on the Shxwelméxwelh today. The numbers revealed a change in results from the previous numbers gathered by Outreach.



Some topics that were discussed by members during this Shxwelméxwelh (Constitution) information sharing campaign included: accountability, capacity, communication, culture, elders, fairness, funding, Grand Chief role, health, infrastructure, internal processes, leadership criteria, membership, natural resources, self-sufficiency, importance of our own laws, youth, elected vs. hereditary, and much more.


We gathered lots of valuable feedback during this process which the SXTA leadership will take into consideration to revise the Constitution based on this input. It is important to note—this vote is **not** the vote for Treaty. This is an important piece of our treaty, but it isn't a vote to go into Treaty. The SXTA is preparing for a vote on the proposed draft governance structure and Shxwelméxwelh (Constitution) in November 2020.
